A Few Notes on Leaven and Evil

Leaven is an ingredient in dough, in which fermentation is still active and which is added to new dough, causing it to rise. In Scripture, this process is used as an illustration of the progressive power of evil, causing defilement. Leaven's power can only be stopped through baking, a result of the application of fire, which speaks of judgment in God's Word. This matter of 'leaven' was serious business in Old Testament times. Before celebrating the Passover, the people had to remove all leaven from their homes and communities (Ex. 12:15, 19t). However, according to Leviticus 23:17, God's earthly people were to be presented to Him, symbolized by two baked wave-loaves containing leaven! Even though leaven was in them, its working had been brought to a halt and therefore the loaves could be presented to God, an apt illustration also of believers today, marked by self-judgment

We may connect these Old Testament illustrations with the instructions given, for example, in 1 Corinthians 5:1-13 and 11:27-32. These directives - if rightly applied - will stop leaven working in the

local assembly. How? First, a wicked person must be excommunicated from among the believers (1 Cor. 5:13). As a result of this discipline, the immoral man of 1 Corinthians 5, repented and was restored again, not only with God, but according to Paul's instructions, he was also to be brought back into fellowship with the assembly. Second, self-judgment by believers in general is needed. The Corinthians were 'puffed up' (this is the result of 'leaven,' also referred to in 1 Cor. 4:6, 18, 19, in contrast to love.

When discipline is no longer practiced collectively (as still was the case in Corinth, for which Paul gave instructions), it remains our personal and individual duty to honour the Lord's rights in separating ourselves from unjudged evil, further explained in 2 Timothy 2.

Dear Saints,

With just two weeks before we return to NZ, there is a lot to do on the "Last minute" lists. But there are always the situations that have to be dealt with that are not on the list, like today, Graham spent all day trying to fix our electric gate. This was not at all in the plan. The sad thig is that now, even the control does not work. He will have to get a specialist in to fix it.

Tonight the Elders of the church met here for a meal. Graham said they had a really profitable time.

The last few weeks have been full on too. We are so thankful for the Lord's help at the Retreat, despite quite a few not being able to get there due to sickness and other situations. But even so we had about 60 attend. The traffic getting to camp caused big problems with the 45 to 60 minute drive taking up to 4 ½ hours. Many did not arrive until after 11pm due to the traffic. But all agreed it was a very special time despite the setbacks. Thank you so much for praying.

The following Friday we headed for San Marcos which is over 2,500 m, where Graham was speaking every night and the day he didn't I met with the ladies.... Another day Graham was able to help for a while, digging the dirt to clear to lay the floor for a new Chapel. They were able to get the walls up 4 years ago but due to Covid and other hindering factors were not able to do more so meanwhile they meet in a large carport. They are now hoping to have an inauguration by Christmas.

Graham is speaking at church on Sunday and the following Sunday the Young People who usually meet here at our home every second Sunday are taking the service. I have put music to Philippians 4: 4-7. I have yet to actually practice with them. Please pray that they will quickly learn and sing it well. It is also the anniversary of the church too, so we are thrilled to be here for this as I actually encouraged those leading the Y.P. to get involved by taking a service. We started the YP's work last year when we were here and it is going really well with good people leading it.

It is always sad leaving home here in Guatemala. We miss the people as so many we have seen grow up from babies and they are very much family. We also look forward to seeing family and friends in New Zealand again. We have 4 days in Los Angeles on our way back to NZ, staying with Julio and Lety Lopez, and visiting some Spanish churches.
