### What is a Castaway?

"But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection; lest that, by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself be a castaway" (1 Cor. 9:27).

This passage has perplexed and troubled many an earnest heart. Many have argued thus, while pondering the above solemn scripture, "If such an one as Paul was uncertain as to the direction of his course, who then can be sure?" But was Paul uncertain as to the issue? By no means. The verse immediately preceding teaches us the very opposite: "I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beats the air." Paul knew guite well how the whole matter was to end, so far as he was concerned. He could say, "I know whom (not merely what) I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I have committed to Him against that day" (2 Tim. 2:12). And again, "I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels,

nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom. 8:38-39).

These scriptures are amply sufficient to prove that Paul had not so much as a shadow of a doubt as to his eternal security. "I know," "I am persuaded." There is no doubt or uncertainty in such utterances. Paul knew better. His foundation was as stable as the throne of God. Whatever certainty Christ could give, that Paul possessed. We are fully convinced that, so far as Paul was concerned, from the moment the scales dropped from his eyes in the city of Damascus until he was offered up in the city of Rome, his heart never once harbored a single doubt, a single fear, a single misgiving.
